DD Dorvillier presents the U.S. premiere of *Danza Permanente* in conjunction with Crossing the Line. The work incorporates four dancers who embody a musical composition by Beethoven. The score was transposed into movement; each dancer performs the part of one instrument, and together they dance as a string quartet.*
